# 1 MARZO

#### Día de las Islas Baleares

On March 1st, it's a chance to dive into the rich culture and traditions of this island. Streets buzz with artisan markets showcasing local products and foods. Plazas transform into stages for 'baile pagès', traditional Ibiza dancing. Cultural activities take center stage too, offering free guided tours of historic monuments, art exhibitions, and talks on the history and heritage of the Balearic Islands.

#### Eivissa Medieval

In May, the historic center of Ibiza, Dalt Vila, morphs into a medieval market. Its cobblestone alleys burst to life with jugglers, musicians, and knights. Craft stalls, local delicacies, and performances at every turn make this festival a truly enchanting experience for visitors of all ages.



### JUNIO

#### **Pride**

In June, Ibiza becomes a gathering place for thousands of visitors from across the globe who come to celebrate and stand up for LGBTQ+ rights. The city streets burst with vibrant parades, while a diverse lineup of events such as workshops, talks, and exhibitions address key issues facing the community. Moreover, numerous beaches transform into settings for inclusive festivities.

#### Virgen del Carmen

On July 16th, the coastline brims with reverence as the patron saint of sailors and fishermen is honored. The Virgin Mary sets sail aboard a boat for a maritime procession. Numerous vessels join this sea pilgrimage, tossing flowers into the water as tribute. As night descends, the festivities persist with lively street parties, fireworks, and merrymaking in the city's squares and streets.



## 5 AGOSTO

#### Virgen de las Nieves

On August 5th, Ibiza celebrates the Virgin of the Snows, its patron saint. The day kicks off with a solemn mass at the Ibiza Cathedral, nestled atop Dalt Vila, the city's old town. After the mass, the procession of the Virgin of the Snows takes place. As dusk settles, the squares and streets of Ibiza buzz with life, offering activities for all ages. Food stalls dish out local delicacies, and the evening culminates with a spectacular fireworks display, marking the end of this memorable day.

#### Sant Ciriac

Saint Ciriac is the city's patron saint, and his festival on August 8th coincides with the commemoration of the 1235 conquest. One of the standout traditions of this celebration is the theatrical portrayal of Ibiza's conquest, known as the "Arrival of the Catalans." As the evening sets in, Ibiza's squares and streets teem with vibrant festivities catering to all ages.
