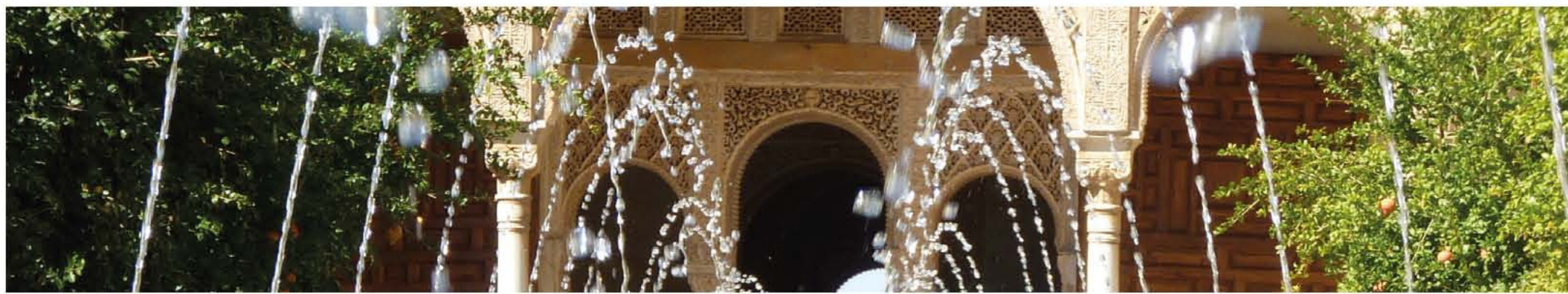

## What to visit

### The Alhambra and Generalife

Undoubtedly, **the global emblem** of Granada is the Alhambra. For information please ask in reception.

### Granada Cathedral and Royal Chapel

Located in the center of Granada, it is just a 15 minute walk from the Hotel, it is the **first Renaissance Cathedral** in Spain, which besides was the place chosen by the Catholic monarchs for their eternal rest.

### Museums

The Archaeological and ethnographic, the one of Catholic Kings, the Museum of Fine Arts, José Guerrero Center or the House Museum of Federico García Lorca represent just a small part of **cultural heritage** offered by the city.

The Park of Science, situated about a 20 minute walk from the Hotel, is also worth visiting or at 2 subway stops (Alcázar del Genil)

### Monasteries

The Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrows, Patroness of Granada, is also one of emblematic monasteries. You can also visit Cartuja Monastery and San Jerónimo Monastery.



### Albaicín and Sacromonte

These are two of the most **colorful, charming and historical neighborhoods** of the city of Granada. In Albaicín, which is considered to be the heritage of humanity, you can visit the Mirador San Nicolás or San Cristóbal. The Sacromonte neighborhood is famous for its caves and Gypsy Zambras.

We recommend La Venta del Gallo.

### Sierra Nevada and the Province

Sierra Nevada, La Alpujarra, Costa Tropical are the **nearby sights** worth visiting during your stay. *visitar con una escapada.*

## Leisure

### Gastronomy

In the Hotel: El Rincón de D. Vicente, à la Cart and daily menu. Asador de Castilla (Escudo del Carmen street, 1 and Campillo square). Poetas Andaluces (Obispo Hurtado street 25). Ruta del Veleta (Monachil). Chikito (Campillo square, 9)

### Tapas time

El Retiro, Los Diamantes, El Mentidero, Las Copas Bar, La Chicotá, La Tana, Cunini, Oliver, La Cueva, Los Manueles Areas of Tapas: Navas street, Nueva square, Campo del Príncipe, Piedra Santa street, Rosario street and Campos square and Toros square, among others.

### Going out for drinks

Because of being a university city, Granada is famous for its bustling nightlife where everybody finds their special atmosphere.

Worth mentioning: Aliatar café, Mae west, Velit, Pedro Antonio de Alarcón street, Ganivet and San Matias 30.

### Shopping time

Granada collects a great variety of shops along its historical streets and villages, mainly in the area of Recogidas Street, Bib-Rambla square, not forgetting Mesones and Puentezuelas. El Corte Inglés is situated in front of the Hotel. The biggest Shopping Center in Andalucía “Nevada Shopping” (Subway Stop “Centro Comercial Nevada”)

## Move on!

Urban Bus: 9 and 11 lines, to go from Ronda road to the city center; line C30 and C32 to go from Plaza Isabel la Católica square to the Alhambra, line C31 to go from Nueva square to Albaicín. Line C34 to go from Nueva square to the Sacromonte.

Subway: 2 stops to Palacio de Congresos, 1 stop to Recogidas, 9 stops to Centro Comercial Nevada, 5 stops to Palacio Deportes (basket) and Estadio Los Cármenes (football).

Aeropuerto: Bus stops at the congress palace, Darro sidewalk, Gran Vía, Triumph, the creek and Violin avenue. (Every day of the week, including Saturdays, Sundays and holidays).
